We, we believe that it is what we're supposed to do as a body of Christ to serve somewhere. And we were just asking, even if you're brand new, you're like, I'm just checking out this church. This is a great way to get to know people serving alongside us. And we have some needs. We have just more and more people coming back in person. And we just want to, you know, put out our ministries, like we should be doing it or what we were doing pre pandemic. So we need to be able to step up. We also have some really key volunteers that we love that are moving away. So we also just need to fill in some holes so we could use your, your help. So I got four areas, ministry. Yeah. Areas that we need specifically helping. But if you don't want these four, that's okay. You can still serve. So what I want you guys to do, if you have your phone, go ahead and pull it out.

Yes. You can pull out your phone right now and go to [arise. denver.com/connect](https://denver.com/connect). That one page arise, denver.com/connect with your online or in person. You can get your phone out and do it. That is kind of our one-stop shop. Pretty much all the stuff that are going on. If you go there, you can click on a button and fill out a form and we'll get you the information. So if you fill out the form that says, serve somewhere, just one little button, you press that button and you feel like, Hey, I might be interested in these one, two, three areas. We're going to send you information. It's not like an obligation that you're gonna have to serve for the rest of your life there. Okay. But you can come and check it out. We'll give you information. See, is this what I thought it was? So these are the four areas where we need some people to step up and serve somewhere. Number one, with elevate kids, we have incredible kids ministry here. We invest in the next generation, but because of pandemic, we've had less kids and therefore we've kind of combined some classes well with more kids coming back and we want to go back to our full slate of class offerings.

So kids can be in an area that's specifically designed for that age. They can hear a lesson specifically designed for them. So we need more people to step up with elevate kids. So if you love kids, if you like kids, if you just want to invest in the next generation, make sure you click that button for elevate kids. If you're saying, Hey, I don't know if I can serve on Sundays, but maybe you could serve in the week setting up prepping for the Sunday. So even if you don't like kids, you should serve the elevate kids. If you can like,

Hey, I can handle a few tasks and put it makes some photocopies and cut, cut some stuff out. So go to elevate kids on that, serve somewhere for them. Fill that one out. So that's the first area. The second area is the worship and tech team. We have three vocalists that we love that are moving away this spring, and we're going to miss them dearly.

And we also have an incredible sound tech, Ben, wherever Ben is, and he's going to be

Or if you love sound, you just love listening to music. You can we'll train you how to be a sound tech. If you can just press buttons on a computer keyboard, you can run slides. If you want to be a Hollywood producer, you can even set our new camera scenes. You know, there's some really cool ways to serve in our tech team. So if you go to elevate or I'm sorry, if you go to that serve summer forum, either click worship team or tech team, we could really use some help with that team. Third area

So with that, we need some people who are willing to bring in baked goods or bake something. I always used to drink a mid, mid service coffee between the two services. And I haven't been

Three kids. Now I need my coffee. Okay. So if you want to be part of the cafe team, yes. Thank you for those two years, make sure you click that. And then the fourth area, this is a new one. We have a new local outreach opportunities. So Denver rescue mission who we partner with,

We love reached out to us. And one of the things they want to do is prevent homelessness. I mean, that sounds good. So then they don't have to provide all the services when someone becomes homeless.

And what they're finding is refugee families especially need help. So what they're doing is providing financial support, but what they need is churches and a team from a church to come alongside these refugee families to help. So they reached out to us just this last week and said, Hey, we have a family that lives right,

Right next to the church, right down the street from us, a family of four that are Burmese refugees. You know where Burma is the country of me and Mar that's having a

Crazy set of conflict right now. Like every day in the news, there's like 80 more people killed

Protests. It's bad over there. And we often think

0 (4m 55s):

Like, there's nothing I can do about it. That's so far in the far East, I don't even know where me and Maurice, well, guess what, we can help them because they're here. They're refugees from that country who are down the street, a family for who needs our help. So they asked us to provide a mentoring team. So if you're interested in that you can partner with his family for a period of six months, just to get to know them, love them, encourage them, help them with some things, if they have questions.

And so with

Your team, you'll check on them once a month. Or w w you know, a few times in the month, depending on how we work it out with the team, we're still figuring this out, right? There'll be training online for how to do this. And you'll commit to these six months. Therefore the general rescue mission has the financial support. We'll just come along to provide the personal support. We can even invite them to church. And I love this family. I think this is a really cool opportunity at there. They asked us to help with, so I hope we get a few

people that can step up to, to serve with one of these. And they're probably a couple more families in the next few months as well, but we got this one right now that needs help. So you can click local outreach and clicked on the button that says refugee mentoring. If you're on that serve somewhere form. So everybody should do Islam. In-person online. These are the things you can do. Even if you're online, you're like, well, how do I serve with this?

We can figure out a way, even if you're not physically present to get you involved with these things, even with the refugee mentor, maybe it's to make phone calls and some send texts to encourage your family. Like, there's some great ways that you can serve whether you're in person or online. So even if you don't live in Colorado, you can serve. That's cool. Huh? Yeah. So I hope that you guys will do that. We want to encourage you to serve somewhere. I know some of you still have your phones out, and if you do, we're going to transition now to our time of giving, which also you can do on your phone or rides.denver.com/give, or we have these wooden boxes. Maybe you haven't even noticed them on the way out this door. And there's two on the way out through these double doors boxes on either side, you can drop off cash and checks. Cause we're not passing around a plate anymore. We don't want to pass around COVID or anything like that.

Right? So just drop your cash, Jack, drop your checks in those boxes. If you want to give, and we do encourage you to give, because God is doing stuff here, God is doing some amazing things. We had 466 people here in person last week. Yeah. That's pretty incredible. Through our C3 services, we had over 400 more. Join us online. Yes. I mean, that's incredible. And we saw over this last week, 10 people make decisions to follow Jesus for the first time. Yes, people are taking steps of faith. People want to get baptized. We're just so excited for that. And when you give, you made that happen. So you make that happen. You're a part of that. Every time that you give a dollar. So we encourage you to do that.

And for a lot of people, that's what they think of heaven. That it seems so

Boring to have endless Aternity of the same day again and again, and again, it,

The popular images of heaven would make it seem that way,

Way boring, and just kind of unearthly. I mean

0 (9m 31s):

About it, whether it's, you know, art or movies or TV shows or whatever, we see these depictions of heaven, it's like, someone's floating on clouds in diapers. That's the title of my message today. So honestly, that's like

the image you see, like, this is what people think of in our culture. When they think of heaven, floating on clouds and diapers that you're just floating around. Like just up there, like wait, and I've seen enough outer space movie.

No, I don't want to do that forever. I mean, it just makes me want to vomit even just thinking about it. And then the mom it's floating around all around. Oh, it doesn't sound fun. Right?

It's like on clouds and diapers, w there's these little fat pudgy babies with diapers on and having

Everywhere, I don't want to wear diapers. So I got three, two kids in diapers right now. I don't want, I don't want to wear diapers. And everybody's in white. You what's up with that. So I can like an N sync music video or something. Somebody is an fan. Okay.

So I don't have to spend my whole life fearing hell or fearing heaven, even more for whatever the tortures of hell. I think the boredom of heaven would be

Even worse. That's what people think about what, or they don't want to believe in it. I

Even heard a pastor. I heard a pastor say, I'm afraid

1 (11m 15s):

Of heaven. It sounds like, hell. I mean, this is

0 (11m 21s):

What we think. And the way we see images of heaven depicted. No wonder why

1 (11m 25s):

It seems so awful. I don't want to do that forever. But I honestly think that this is like

0 (11m 33s):

Satan's way to get us to stop believing, honestly, because we have such a poor view of what heaven is. That's not at all like what the Bible is.

It says what we're going to learn today. Randy Elkhorn,

0 (11m 44s):

Christian author theologian. He has a great book called heaven.

1 (11m 47s):

I always recommend this book.

0 (11m 49s):

Good. It looks at all the scriptures in the Bible on heaven. And then uses that to say, Hey, what could have be like, it answers a bunch of questions we have or, or tries to provide the best answer we can have as we think about heaven. So I always recommend this book. It's great to just have on your shelf. If you have questions about heaven and in it, I'm going to reference him maybe a couple more times in this message. But in it, he says this, he says some of Satan's favorite lies

Or about heaven for Satan need not convince us that heaven doesn't exist. He needed

0 (12m 16s):

Only convince us that heaven is a place of boring, an earthly existence.

1 (12m 21s):

I think he's right. And that's

0 (12m 24s):

Why today we are going to combat those lies

1 (12m 26s):

From Satan to learn

0 (12m 28s):

About heaven as it really is, as, as told

1 (12m 31s):

Us from God and his word, we're going to learn today. And this is so good. You're going to remember this. You need to remember this. That heaven is life. As it was meant to be heaven is life as it was meant to be. So the way we're gonna live

0 (12m 48s):

And about heaven is by looking around at our life as, as the scriptures teach us and we're going to see some things and it's going to point us forward to what heaven is actually going to be like, not floating around wearing white.

It's gonna be so much better than that. So in this series

0 (13m 3s):

We're going to do is tackle a different topic over the next four weeks. We're calling this series better than you think. Because as in his first message, heaven is better than you think next week, we're going to talk about how you know, our salvation is better than you think it's not working super hard. Like you're climbing up Mount Everest and maybe I can make it to the top. No, no, no. Salvation is way better than you think. Then after that, we're going to talk about rules because everybody thinks Christianity is all about the rules. It's a straight jacket,

But Christianity

Is way better than you think in the last week, we're going to talk about us Christians. Because as Christians, we have a bad rap of being hateful, hypocrites that are

Outdated. And in that message, we're going to learn that Christians, the churches

Way better than you think. So in this message, I hope that we break some of these bad ideas we have. If you're joining us online, maybe you're not even a Christian, that's this great. This whole series is perfect for

you because we're going to combat a lot of the lies. People think about heaven, about it,

Christianity, about the church, and we're going to learn. Even Christians need to learn this stuff. I think even Christian.

So if you're joining us for the first time today or you're coming back after Easter, cause he, she was awesome. Whether online or in person, I want you to commit

To coming to these four weeks. Okay. You're

0 (14m 8s):

Already here. One, boom, you got it. You got three more weeks that I want you to commit to. So set your alarm now. Yeah. On our phones, we can say every Sunday I want to wake up at okay, all online. Maybe you're going to set a reminder and say, Hey, I'm gonna make sure that I watch every week because this series is going to be so important. As we do learn that it's so much

Better than you think. And today we're gonna learn about heaven. So if you have your Bible, go ahead and open it to Isaiah chapter 65, Isaiah chapter 65, we're going to start in verse 17 on your phone. You can get there in the YouVersion Bible app that happened.

It's really cool because we have an event for our church. You can search for and you can find just your eyes, search Denver. It has the scriptures. It has the points. You can take notes. You can save it onto your phone. You have that with you. So Isaiah chapter 65, we're going to go verse 17 all the way to 25 in that chapter as we learn, and we see this vision of heaven that comes from God's mouth through the prophet

Zia. So I'll start there in verse 17. See,

0 (15m 8s):

I will create, God says new

1 (15m 10s):

Heavens and a new earth.

0 (15m 13s):

See, I will create, he's telling us about something. He will do. That's coming in the future. I will create new heavens and a new

1 (15m 20s):

Earth. Some of your wondering what's wrong with the current heaven. Okay. So we're talking about today.

0 (15m 26s):

So I just want to make sure we're all on the same page as we talk about having, because people can mean a lot of different things when they talk about heaven. So right now, where are you

1 (15m 36s):

Earth? That's right. If you're not, I'll pray for you after the service.

0 (15m 40s):

We're on, we're on earth, right? We are in earth right now in this life. We are here on earth that as we're here

1 (15m 48s):

And see earth, okay, welcome to planet earth.

0 (15m 51s):

Some of you need that reminder. We are on earth. This is our life. As we're living this life

1 (15m 55s):

It's earth. Well, when we die, if you are a believer in Jesus, Christ

0 (16m 2s):

Are going to what often is referred to as happen. Okay? That's, that's kinda the next step. You die. You're a believer in Jesus Christ. You go to heaven. Jesus called it paradise to the man that was on the cross next to him. And he put his faith in Jesus Christ. At the very end, Jesus said today, you will be with me in paradise paradise. Paul, who has his own vision of heaven in Philippians chapter, one says to depart from the body to depart from earth is to be present with the Lord to be home with the Lord. That's the word home. So I like the word paradise. I liked the word home. That's what it talks about about this current heaven, where God lives. This is where God is reigning, where Jesus himself is raining on a throne where the angels are ministering to God.

And this is heaven, but theological,

0 (16m 46s):

Strictly speaking, we could call it the intermediate heaven, the intermediate heaven, or some people even call it the temporary heaven because God says I'll create a new heaven, right? So there's this intermediate heaven. We're not told a ton about what this is like in the scriptures a little bit here and there it's paradise. It's going to be at home. It's going to be awesome, but it's not actually as Christians. Our ultimate hope. What we are hoping for is the news

1 (17m 9s):

Heaven, the new heaven.

0 (17m 12s):

So at the very end, you know, after that doomsday prepper stuff that we were talking about when Jesus returns, or if we die before Jesus returns, we are resurrected. It says, and God is going to create a new heavens and a new earth. So, so this new heaven is actually our ultimate health home, where we're spending

1 (17m 31s):

For eternity earth that you died.

0 (17m 35s):

If you die, before Jesus comes back, you go to that intermediate heaven. And then at the very end, we'll have resurrected bodies on the new heavens and the new earth. Now that second arrow, that's where all the Christians debate and argue about what actually happens during that time period. What is it going to be like? Is there going to be a where Jesus is going to rain on earth? We're not going to talk about any of that today. We're talking about at that very end new heaven, okay. This is our ultimate hope where we're ultimately hoping to be. Whatever happens in that arrow.

The ultimate

0 (18m 1s):

Hope is the new heavens and the new earth. So when Isaiah is this prophet and he's this mouthpiece for God is God is saying, Hey, I'm going to make a new heaven. I'm going to make a new earth. That's what he's talking about. So when I talk about heaven today, that's what I'm referring to. Okay? The ultimate heaven, our ultimate hope

1 (18m 20s):

That we'll be with forever. And

0 (18m 22s):

So this is what I want to see next that the new earth is the new heaven they're combined. And we actually see this in revelation chapter 21, the second to last chapter in the entire Bible, John, one of the disciples of Jesus has his own vision of heaven. And in revelation, chapter 21,

Starting in verse three, I don't, you've got to learn where everything is now. Revelation

0 (18m 44s):

21. John has this vision. He says, then I saw a new heaven and a new earth

1 (18m 48s):

Quotes there. He's quoting Isaiah chapter 65. And he has this vision, one

0 (18m 53s):

Of the new heaven and the new earth for the first heaven. And the first earth had passed away.

1 (18m 59s):

Here's as we know, it will, will be destroyed, but they will in its place will be a new heaven and a new earth. But then this is

0 (19m 6s):

The good part. It says, I saw the Holy city, then the new Jerusalem coming down out of heaven

1 (19m 10s):

From God prepared as a bride, beautifully dressed for her husband. So

0 (19m 16s):

This image is really important because what happens at a wedding with a bride,

1 (19m 20s):

The husband? Well, we believe the two become one flesh. There was a couple of times

0 (19m 26s):

Baptized a few weeks ago, Justin and Liza. I don't know if you remember them. I officiated their web wedding here last night. It was fun. I kind of planned it in the last week and we did a ceremony. It's awesome because what we celebrate, why we love weddings is the two, two separate people become one flesh. It's one unit, one family. Now

It's a new thing. So in the same way, having

This Holy city is coming down to the

1 (19m 48s):

New earth, like a bride prepared for the groom, right?

0 (19m 51s):

And then the two become one. And that's why it says in verse three, next

1 (19m 56s):

We can. And

0 (19m 57s):

I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, look, God's dwelling place is now among the people. And he will dwell

1 (20m 3s):

With them. God himself, heaven itself

0 (20m 8s):

Comes down. And the new heavens and new earth are

1 (20m 10s):

One. So what we look forward to is the new earth made new,

0 (20m 14s):

Like it was supposed to be at the very beginning in the garden of Eden. Now it's going to be made new. It's going to be perfect without destruction, without death, without any of the blemishes that are part of our earth right now. And heaven itself, we won't have to wait. It's way up, up there. Floating in clouds. No, no, no heaven is coming down onto the Newark.

1 (20m 32s):

Do you get that? So that's,

0 (20m 33s):

That's why my big idea today is heaven is life. As it was meant to be the new earth is

1 (20m 40s):

Earth. Is there 2.0 it's earth? The way it was meant to be heaven is life as it was meant to be. So now on the same page about this new heaven and new earth that the scriptures actually teach us about what we're going to learn. Three different things about how it is life as it was meant to be. And the first thing is that heaven is happiness, as it was meant to be heaven is happiness as it was meant to be. So let's look at the second half of verse 17 and Isaiah 65, the former things will not be remembered. It says, nor will they come to mind. So this is God talking about the new heaven. The former things will not be remembered, nor will they come to mind.

1 (21m 23s):

Now this is really good news because we all have bad memories. We have things that we have done that we feel guilty and remorseful for. We have terrible things that have happened to us. We carry around shame. Some of us trauma from our past, all those awful evil things from the past won't even come to mind anymore. Now people wonder if this means that we won't be able to remember what earth was like. And I don't think so. I just think heaven is going to be so good. We're going to be so filled with the happiness in heaven that we won't even think about that you guys know this in your happiest moments. You're not reliving the awful things from your past because your mind is filled with the good things of the present.

1 (22m 8s):

So in the same way in heaven, those things, aren't going to come to mind. We're not going to remember them. Not because we can't remember because we've, we all need to. And man, this is good news because there are those things in our past that make us unhappy in the present. Aren't there. The shame we carry around the guilt, we carry around the trauma IAV. That's my daughter. I love you. So that's the first thing that we notice here. So, so that's why it's to be happiness as it was meant to be. But, but it goes on in verse 18. Ooh, I like this person, but be glad and rejoice forever. Do you know what the word rejoice means? Be happy forever in what I will create for, I will create Jerusalem to be a delight and its people, a joy, the people who are there in heaven, the believers in Jesus Christ, you and I, we put our faith in Jesus.

1 (23m 2s):

We will be joy for each other. And for ourselves even get this verse 19, I God says I will rejoice over Jerusalem and take delight in my people. God's going to be happy. He says the sound of weeping and crying will be hurting it. No more said last week that there's a lot of things to cry about in this world, right? I want to be nice to not ever have to cry about anything ever again. And that sounds good. No more weeping, no more crying. We won't hear anybody else crying either. There's only going to be happiness, only joy only goodness. And it's going to be happiness as it was meant to be. I see happiness as it was meant to be because in this life we have moments of happiness.

Don't we great. Happiness is moments that make your heart sing and leap

0 (23m 49s):

Good. We even say things like that, or it's like a taste of heaven or, or a slice of heaven. You know, we say things like this because that's what it is.

The best happiness we have in this life is just a little foretaste of what is to come. But it's a tiny little foretaste, just a little bit, because what happens in this birth right now, we have that moment and it's gone a moment

Later. You're thinking about even the moment,

Right? And then it's gone and we try to,

0 (24m 21s):

We create that moment. We try to stay in that moment as long as we can. That's why we go to concerts. That's why we go on trips. That's why people spend millions and billions of dollars building houses and building Disney world the happiest place on earth, because we want to find that happiness. Even if it's just for a moment, we spend tons of money on food and we, we get people together and it's all these. So we can get those glimpses of happiness now. Right?

Saying any of that is bad, although you shouldn't waste all your money, chasing those fleeting things that oftentimes the best ones are free, right?
