We're gonna give this one. This is a 2.1. So you could win Kenton. We're gonna give this two points is our final question. So what do you think Roxanne,

2 (4m 50s):

That'd be an interesting church. Church,

1 (4m 55s):

Church pot shop. It is the jaw healing church of cannabis. So you both, you both are winners on that one. All right. Can we give a hand to our contestants? Thank you guys. Yeah, that was great, right? Yeah. Good work on that. It's funny, right? It it's funny that, that we do that. And sometimes it's kind hard to know, but it it's also serious because here in, in Denver, there are more pot shops than there are gospel preaching churches. I don't know if you know that, that then when we look around that, we're in a city with twice as many dogs as Christians, that in a five mile radius of our church, there 350,000 men, women and children who don't go to church anywhere.

1 (5m 46s):

And when we see things like that, we wonder is the church dying is the church dying because we look back into the past in our country and we're like, Hey, things used to, to be better. Christian Wise, that, that membership, this is membership in churches up until 2000 up until the two year, 2000 wavered around 70% of our nation from 1930, when they started tracking it till about 2000, 70% of people at least said they were members of a church somewhere. That number has dropped since then to where it's now at 47% of our country, 47%. All of the top four denominations in the us have shrunk over the last decade.

1 (6m 28s):

Attendance at church after world war II, right after world war II is about 50% of people would be in a church

on a given Sunday. Today that number is under 20% of church attendance in the pandemic. Things have gotten much worse. That one third of regular churchgoers. So regular churchgoers, pre pandemic have stopped going anywhere in person or online since the pandemic one third, they say that every year, 6,000 churches close their doors and 3,500 Americans leave Christianity every day, Colorado. I think it's even worse.

1 (7m 10s):

It makes us wonder if Sam Harris, the atheist philosopher is right when he wrote in his book, the end of faith, the entire project of religion seems perfectly backward. It cannot survive. The changes that have come over us, culturally, technologically, and even ethically. That's what people think. And when you look at the news, when you drive around and see old church buildings getting leveled or turned into nightclubs, that's here in Denver, right? The church, you see that. And you're like, wow, the church has lost its power. Culturally. It really has right. It's influence in the media. It's influence in politics. It seemed like Christianity has an all time low when it comes to influence.

1 (7m 53s):

When we look at all those things, a lot of Americans think that the church is dying, but I'm here to tell you that it's not. In fact, the church right now is growing and is bigger and stronger than it ever has been before. And it's exactly what Jesus told us would happen. So we're gonna look today at a verse from Jesus, and we're gonna wrap up this perfect church series in this series we are seeing. And just being honest, like the church has lots of problems. We've talked about 'em the church has problems. It hurts people. It does stupid things. There's conflict. There's division. Like I, I shared about how my church, when I was a teenager split in half, that that it's awful.

1 (8m 35s):

We see leaders in, in churches, pastors fall and fail us entire churches and denominations falling away. And when we see all that, we think that the church is dying, but this perfect church series, I, I hope is going to end by saying like, Hey, the church, isn't dying at all. It's thriving. And why we're doing this entire series is for two purposes, two purposes, one to lower your expectations. You lower your expectations. The church has never been perfect, nor will it be perfect. So lower your expectations, especially if you're looking for the perfect church, sorry, you're not gonna find it lower your expectations. And two, we're trying to raise our actions we have got to do and be better because we are the church.

1 (9m 19s):

You can't point the finger. We are the church. You can't escape it. If you're a Christian, you're the church. So we need to be better. So that's our goal for this entire series. And I hope today that you will learn that the church is actually winning. So I want to challenge you today to join the winning team. We know the end of the book. We know what's gonna happen. The church of Jesus Christ will win. So it's time to join the winning team, join the winning team. So we are gonna look at really one verse. We're gonna deep dive on one verse

from Matthew 16, 18. So if you have a Bible, you can open up with me there. If you have your smartphone, go ahead and pull that out. If you use the Bible app, the U version Bible app, you can find our rice church, Denver event follow along and take notes right there in the app.

1 (10m 5s):

And we're gonna look at this verse because it is a verse when Jesus talked about the church, he only talked about the church a few times, and this probably is the first time. At least the first time we have recorded and Jesus in Matthew 16, 18 says this. He says, and I tell you that you are Peter. And on this rock, I will build my church. And the gates of Hades will not overcome it. So Jesus's own word. He's saying I'm gonna build church. And the gates of Hades will not overcome it. Okay? So what's going on here? Jesus is talking to his disciples and in particular, he points out Peter Simon, Peter, and he points him out because they're in this discussion of who Jesus actually is.

1 (10m 55s):

People had all sorts of ideas. Jesus is a great teacher. He's a great prophet. Maybe he's, you know, somebody reincarnated like they, everybody has all these rumors about who Jesus is. So Jesus asked his disciples, his followers. He's like, you guys have been around me for a little while. Who do you say I am? And Simon, Peter was like, I got it. You are the Messiah, the son of the living. God. And Jesus is like, ding, ding, ding. We have a winner. Finally, someone got it. So the Messiah he's the long awaited anointed one, the savior who God had predicted through the prophets for hundreds and thousands of years. He's the savior. The Messiah finally come. And he's the son of God. He's much more than just a human being.

1 (11m 36s):

He's the one and only divine man. So Simon, Peter got it. And Jesus is like, Peter, you got it. Your profession of faith. You're the first person to ever recognize who I truly am. And because you profess that faith, I will build my church on you and your profession of faith. That's what Jesus is saying here. It's interesting because there's a word play that we miss in the English because the name Peter meant the rock. You see this probably wasn't the time it was probably in John chapter one when Jesus first met Peter, his name was Simon. That was his given name. Jesus meets him. And he's like, okay, I'm gonna call you Peter. Which means the rock long before Dwayne Johnson, Peter was the rock.

1 (12m 20s):

Okay. His name means rock. And so when Jesus is saying here, he's like, you're the rock and I'm gonna build my church on the rock. Do you guys see that? So he's, he's pointing out Peter. But what I think is really interesting here is where Jesus said this. It just gives us one little reference at the beginning of this section, where it says that they were in the region of Caesarea Philippi. This is in the Northern part of Israel. And there in Caesarea Philippi was a rock formation that would've been very prominent. Like if I say South Dakota, like you guys are like, oh yeah, okay. Mountain Rushmore there in Caesarea Philippi was this big, big rock cliff face. That was beautiful. And there was the grotto of pan.

1 (12m 60s):

There was this like spring that was built into the side of it, this like little cave there and what they did to worship pan, who was, you know, one of the Greek gods, they built a temple there. And like, it was the pagans and the Greeks and the Romans. They all built different temples there to worship there. They were like, wow, this is such an incredible rock phase. Everybody went there. This is the rock on which they built their temple generation after generation. We don't know exactly where Jesus was when he was teaching, but he was in this region. And when he's in this region visiting with his disciples, he's like, Hey, everybody's been building temples on a rock. Jesus said, I'm going to build my church on you, Peter, the rock, you guys get this.

1 (13m 41s):

He's he's shifting things because everybody had built temples on rocks or on mountains. That's what everybody had done for generations. Even the temple in Jerusalem was built on the temple Mount there on Mount Zion. Everybody had been built on rocks, but Jesus, like, I don't need a rock anymore. I've got people. See the word church is the Greek word. EIA means the ones who are called out in assembly of people. It's not about a building or an EDUs. That's not what it is at all. The church is a group of people. So he's like Peter, you're the first guy. And you are gonna be the church where all the churches are built upon. Interesting. Right?

1 (14m 21s):

So that's why the church has nothing to do with the building. It doesn't matter about the buildings. So when we see buildings being shut down left and right, the church isn't dying, cuz the church never was a building, never was. And what I also love about how Jesus is building there is that he's building from the very beginning, this foundation on someone named Peter who was imperfect imperfect. Now in Ephesians two 20 Paul kind of explains this concept of how works he says as God's household, that's us. We, the people, we, the church you are built on the foundation of the apostles and the prophets people like Peter with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone and a first message in the series.

1 (15m 5s):

I had bricks literally up here and I had one white brick like Jesus is the cornerstone. He's the one perfect brick in the entire church. And here we see, even from the beginning, the first brick to be put next to Jesus was an imperfect brick. Peter, because in the same scene, in the same scene here in Matthew's 16, Jesus like ding, ding, oh my gosh, Peter's the first one to proclaim the truth of who I am. Then Peter is like, but Jesus, you don't have to suffer and die. Do you know what Jesus says to Peter? One sentence after he's like, you're the rock? Do you know what he says? Get behind me, Satan, Peter, who just had it all figured out Jesus like you are the enemy right now.

1 (15m 48s):

Peter was imperfect there at the very beginning. Jesus knew what was going on. He knew that Peter would do and say a whole bunch of boneheaded things that he would run away when Jesus needed him most. And that Peter would even be racist. I don't know if you knew this, but Peter for a while, as the leader in the church, like the top dog would spend all his time with the Jewish Christians and ignore the non-Jewish Christians. So Paul had to confront him to his face, the leader of the whole church until Pete Peter repented. So Jesus knew all of those imperfections that were in Peter and he still chose him. So that should give us some hope. If he'll use Peter to build his church, I think he'll use us too.

1 (16m 31s):

No matter what you've done or how far you've fallen or no matter the stupid things you do that doubts. You have. Jesus still wants to use you to build his church. Isn't that good news. And it also means that you need to join the winning team. We have enough critics of the church. There's enough people writing blogs, tweeting, publishing in the newspaper, saying all the awful things about everything. It is easy to find flaws in the church. I can tell you a hundred flaws in our church. I know more than any of you combined. I do. We have lots of imperfections in our church, lots of flaws. Now we're never gonna stop trying to get better and grow, but I'm telling you this is because some of you need to stop church shopping, stop looking around because you'll never find a perfect church.

1 (17m 21s):

In fact, our whole series is based on a quote from a sermon from Charles Spurgeon. I want you to read this whole quote. Spurgeon says this. He said, if I had never joined a church till I had found one, that was perfect. I should never have joined one at all. And the moment I did join it, if I had found one, I should have spoiled it. And he goes on to say this for it would not have been a perfect church after I had become a member of it. Still imperfect as it is. It is the dearest place on earth to us. It's imperfect. It was imperfect from the first brick that got laid. Peter was far from perfect.

1 (18m 1s):

And yet God chooses to use imperfect bricks to build his church. So some of you need to stop being a church critic and start getting in the game. Anybody can be a Monday morning quarterback. It is hard to get on the field and play the game. And that's what Jesus called each. And every one of us too, if you follow him, you are part of the church, whether you like it or not. So let's get in the game. Let's get in the game and start playing. Join the winning team because it is the winning team. I wanna look again at verse 18 of Matthew 16, Jesus says, and I tell you that you are Peter. And on this rock, I, I will build my church. Do you see that?

1 (18m 41s):

I will build my church? He doesn't say Peter, you'll build a great church for yourself. It's not Peter's church. It's not pastor Matt's church. It's not arises church. It's not a Baptist church. It's not a Presbyterian church. It's no one's church, but Jesus's church. And it never was anybody else's church. So when you see churches fall and fade away and even denominations struggle and collapse, doesn't matter because Jesus's church is

still growing. It's still having an impact really is. We talked about bill Hybels a couple weeks ago. He was one of the greatest leaders to impact the American church over the last 40 years, huge impact for his church.

1 (19m 26s):

Willow Creek in Chicago made a huge influence. And he always used to say something that everybody quotes nowadays, he would say over and over again, that the church is the hope of the world. But now bill Hybels has had a failure. He's fallen. His church is struggling. And a lot of people are looking at that and say, Hey look, the church is dying. It's no good. But bill Hybels was not the hope of the world. Willow Creek church was never the hope of the world. The church of Jesus is the hope of the world. And we need to know that truth. That even when churches fall, when pastors struggle, when Christians are awful, the church of Jesus, it's going strong, it's going strong.

1 (20m 8s):

And we've gotta know that trick. It was always Jesus' church. And he said, not only is it my church, but I'm gonna build it. You can be part of it. Like we get to put like the mortar down. Maybe Jesus is the one building it. We do our tiny little part and think we've done so much. Jesus is building his church. And I say that because if an individual church goes away, maybe Jesus is just building his church somewhere else. Maybe he's just building somewhere else. And that actually is how it works. See an individual church might not make it a denomination, might not make it, but the church of Jesus going, he's building something.

1 (20m 49s):

And he's realizing like, if people aren't gonna get on board here, I'm gonna go over here and I'm gonna work. If people want to criticize the church, I'll go to another country. He'll keep going. He's building something and we gotta decide, are we gonna be part of the winning team? Now? I said that the, the top four denominations in our country are, are dwindling and, and they're decreasing in numbers. It's true. I, I think it's really cool that we get to be a part of a movement of churches called converge. That's actually growing that. We're one of the few groups that are growing in our country. There's some other great ones too. But let me just tell you about converge Scott Wright out who's. Our president actually was here in Denver a couple weeks ago and he came over to our building, toured it.

1 (21m 30s):

I got to spend like three hours with him, which is awesome. He's an incredible guy. And I was talking with him and, and he shared some numbers with me. He said since 2014, when he became the president president, our, our it's not a domination. A movement of churches has grown from 1,208 churches to 1500. And what's really cool. Is that in 20 14, 20 2% of the churches in converge were non Anglo meaning they were either in ethnic church or they were church with less than 80% white. Right? You guys tracking with me on that? So 22% in 2014 today, it's 42%.

1 (22m 12s):

So that's really cool. We're not only growing as a movement of churches, but we're growing to include more and more people groups in our churches in the past two years, converge has planted 79, new churches, 79 new churches. And that's just in the us because we partner with different organizations around the world. Converge has helped to either fund or, or supply training or whatever it takes to plant 8,915 churches worldwide. In the last two years, we've sent 134 new global missionaries in the last two years.

1 (22m 52s):

And that's just converge. Like we get to be a part of the winning team here at converge, like, which is awesome. But even beyond converge, if you look worldwide at the church of Jesus Christ, I don't know if you guys knew this, but people only see what's in the United States, but even in north America. So if you include all of north America, we only represent 12% of the Christians in the world. We're the minority on top of that. If, if you look in Latin America and the Caribbean, that is 25% of the Christians around the world, Sub-Saharan Africa has another 25%. We American Christians are the minority in places like Asia.

1 (23m 37s):

And in particular countries like Brazil, Nigeria, and the Philippines that churches are exploding in numbers. They're exploding around the world. That today 2.4 billion people claim the name of Jesus Christ, their Lord and savior. That's one third of the population of the entire world. And the church is on trend to keep growing. Do you guys know that the news doesn't tell you that the media doesn't tell you that driving down the street, seeing a church shut down, doesn't tell you that we are so ethnocentric that we don't even realize what God's doing around the world, but he is. And I think what happens is when people start criticizing the church and stop getting in the game, Jesus is like, I'm building my church.

1 (24m 21s):

I'll just go somewhere else. I'll just go somewhere else. So I want to be a part of the winning team. I want a rise church, Denver, to be part of the winning team. And we are right now. We are a church that's growing, which is awesome. We're, we're happy about it. And we wanna keep growing. We wanna keep being the bricks that, that God uses Jesus is building his church. So let's join the winning team. Let's join the winning team. It's time to get in the game. Jesus has enough fans. He wants us to be players in the game and here's the great thing we will win.

1 (25m 2s):

Jesus promised it. We will win. He promised this in verse 18. Let's look at it again. Jesus said, and I tell you that you are Peter. And on this rock, I will build my church. And the gates of Hades will not overcome it. The gates of Hades, that's the Greek word for hell. The, the underworld, the realm of the dead Jesus is like, I, I don't care. What happens. The church will conquer hell. Death itself cannot defeat us the enemy. Can't take us down, let alone anything happening in the United States. Are you kidding me? Jesus says, we're gonna win. The gates of Hades will not overcome it.

1 (25m 44s):

He promised it and that's what's happening. That's what's happening worldwide. And if you ever don't think it's happening, I want you to think about the cross. Think about the cross. When I say the word cross, what do you guys think of Christianity? You drive by a building. You expect to see the cross. That's why we're all confused about the pot dispensaries, right? Where's the cross we don't know. Okay. So across to us means Christianity, but across in Jesus' day, you know what it meant, torture and execution. See the Romans were well known because that was their favorite form of torture and execution. Sometimes hundreds or thousands of people would be crucified at the same time when Jesus was crucified, there were two other criminals with him and they put him up all over the place, all over the Roman empire to like remind people who was in charge.

1 (26m 35s):

That's what it meant. That's what it meant. And as Christianity grew, the Romans used the on Christians, Peter himself history tells us was crucified upside down. He chose, he didn't. He said he didn't wanna go right side up because that's the way his savior died. But Christians left and right were being crucified because the numbers of Christianity grew, it started with Peter and then 11 of the 12 disciples and then 120 Christians on the day of Pentecost. Then that grew to 3000. And then to 5,000 historians think that by the end of the first century 80, there was a hundred thousand Christians. And then it started to make a dent in the Roman empire. And the Romans started disliking Christians.

1 (27m 16s):

They were making big waves because they loved people. They gave the poor food. They would take infants that got left. It was legal to leave your infants in trash heaps. If you didn't want 'em, the Christians would pick them up and adopt them and take care of them. So the church just kept expanding because they kept loving and caring for people. And it became such a dominant force that the Romans hated it. They called Christians atheist. Why? Because they were getting people to stop worshiping all the gods. They must hate the gods they're atheists. So they started torturing them, imprisoning them and killing them on crosses often, but also in places like the Coliseum, places like the Coliseum, which is where the games were played. And often they would take Christians after they had arrested 'em.

1 (27m 57s):

And when they wouldn't turn away from their faith, when they wouldn't renounce Jesus, they would take 'em naked, throw 'em into the games so that they could be eaten by lions while people watched and cheered. And in those days we have some of the writings from early Christians, they wrote they're like the church is dying because people were turning away from faith and droves, as they were getting persecuted, people would be like, yeah, I'm gonna I'll deny Jesus. Cause I'd rather live and not beaten by a lion, but it kept happening. And it became such an influential force. As the church kept growing that finally, an emperor decided to become a Christian and then declared that the Roman empire was a Christian empire so much so that they shut down the games.

1 (28m 41s):

And one of the early popes dedicated the Coliseum to the suffering of Christ. Did you know this? And right now there's a cross hanging in the Coliseum. And there's a plaque that reads basically in memory of the martyrs who were killed. The reason why we know Jesus is gonna win is because of the cross in the Coliseum. And I can tell you if he doesn't come back, Jesus, doesn't come back in the next a thousand years, there will be no more Coca-Cola there will be no more apple. NFL will be gone. The United States of America will be gone, but the church of Jesus Christ will still be standing.

1 (29m 26s):

Choose the winning team, choose the winning team. I'm I'm, I'm serious. We've gotta join the winning team. What's really interesting about this passage. I, I I'd thought about it for so long because that phrase that Jesus used, the gates of hell will not prevail. And you know, you think about a gate and, and even in English and in Greek, it can be like representative for an army. Like these are the forces of the enemy, right? The gates. But I was like, well, Jesus could have just said army, but he didn't. He said, the gates of hell, the gates of Hades will not prevail or overcome the church. And I thought about this, a gate is something that's stationary.

1 (30m 8s):

It stays there. It doesn't move. And when you go to war, you actually go and attack the gates of the enemy. You bring your catapults and towers and you go up and lay siege to the gates of the enemy to take them down. So I think when Jesus was saying that gates in hell, he wasn't saying, Hey, we're on defense. No, we are on offense. We're on offense. And, and while he was there, this is the craziest thing I showed you at the beginning, there was that grotto of pan, you know, where they would worship pan the God of the underworld. You know, that goat guy played a flute seriously. And they would go to this pit and, and there was like dark water that there he is right there.

1 (30m 48s):

In case you didn't know who that is, they would worship me. And the water was so dark. They couldn't see the bottom of the spring. So they, they called that place. The gates of Hades. This is the gate of hell, the gate of the underworld, where the dead would come up. And what they would do is they would sacrifice a goat and throw it down there to pan. And if the goat sunk, that meant the gods of the underworld were happy. If the goat still floated well, then they had better sacrifice another goat until they sink not knowing that it just had to do with the amount of oxygen in their lungs. But that's beside the point, they would sacrifice at the gates of hell. There is the gates of hell. And Jesus is preaching there in Caesar of Philippi.

1 (31m 30s):

So when he says, Peter, you're the rock. I'm gonna build my church on you and your profession of faith and the gates of hell. We're here. We're at the gates of hell. It will not prevail against us. We're going in to the

gates of hell and we're attacking. We're going behind enemy lines and we're gonna win. And we know that we will win because Jesus won. Jesus went on one of those Roman crosses and he was tortured. He was executed and they took down his body and they put it in the tomb.

4 (32m 5s):

It looked
