0 (0s):

I have a question for you. Where will you be when it ends? Where will you be when it ends? And I'm not saying where are you going to lunch after this service? Okay, where will you be when either you die or the world ends? Where will you be? I think it's maybe one of the most important questions we need to ask ourselves, where will you be? And some of you are immediately thinking, well hey, I don't, I don't know about all that, that stuff I, I just, I'm not sure. Well you might not know, you might not be sure, but if there is something after this life, you need to think about it.

0 (45s):

And what the Bible is gonna teach us very clearly what God is gonna tell us through his word is that there are only two destinations for every single human being on this planet only to heaven or hell life or death to shine or to shame. Those are the only two options. They're only two. So where will you stand when it ends? Some of you are immediately being like, well I don't like the idea of hell. Like, that's not fun. Well of course it's not. Nobody likes the idea of hell. And that's why it's even more important than we talk about it. Because if it's even just a remote possibility that you could go there, don't you wanna make sure you don't?

0 (1m 26s):

And that's why we need to talk about today. And what we're gonna talk about is not only important for your life, but important for your eternity. Because there are only two different locations as the Bible and as Jesus make very, very clear. So we are wrapping up today our series through the book of Daniel. And actually it's been two series and the second series has been in the second half of Daniel, which is the weird half, right? The half that everybody skips people if they know anything about Daniel as a character in the Bible, they're like they know the first half of the book of Daniel when he becomes a vegetarian. When Shara, Misk and Bendigo go in the fire and don't get burned when he gets thrown in the lions den when there's writing on the wall. You may have heard some of those stories about Daniel, but then people get to the second half and they skip it cuz it's so weird.

0 (2m 7s):

It's Daniel as an older man having this series of visions of God showing us a peak behind the scenes. And these visions have shown some of the things in the future. They've also shown some of the supernatural around us. And today we're going to see what happens at the very end when it ends. We're gonna get this peak into the future. And if you've missed this series in chapter seven, in the first message in this series, we saw that that there's going to be conflict, there's gonna be wars, there's things that are going to happen. But the good news is we win. That's what we got to learn. Like God has written the future of the story. He's the author and we win. So it's great news.

0 (2m 48s):

In the second week we saw a lot of history, 330 years of history that God accurately told Daniel what was going to happen through the Persian Empire, through the Greek Empire. And what we learned is that history is his story. And that's so significant for us because we go through things, we don't know what's going to

happen. But our story is his story as well. He's already written it. So no matter what happens in all things, God works for the good of those who love him. History is his story. Our story is his story. And then in week three we saw Daniel realizing that the reason why God's people had been taking as slaves into exile and Babylon was because of their sin. Our sin has consequences. The bad things we do lead to bad things happening to us. And so Daniel repented and it was a great model for us, wasn't it?

0 (3m 31s):

And we learned a lot of us like want our prayers to be answered. Well God responds to repentance to those who confess that they're sinners and they need some help. That's who God listens to. And we together learned that. And we actually practiced some repentance that day, didn't we? And then last week as, as we started this final vision of Daniel, because it actually goes from chapters 10 through 12, we're gonna be in chapter 12 today. We, we saw what God was teaching and and in those two chapters we begin to see the supernatural. That there are angels and demons. That there is a war going on. And we learn that our struggle is not against flesh and blood. Sometimes we get drawn into political battles and we think that's what's gonna be, it's like national things. It's gonna be this fight over the school board.

0 (4m 12s):

No, no, no. Our struggle is a supernatural struggle and we need to learn how to fight that battle. So that's what we learned last week. And today as we wrap up this message, this series in in the book of Daniel, we're gonna learn a super important truth about when it ends. And it's this, you guys listening, lean in a little bit. We're gonna learn this. How you stand determines if you'll shine. How you stand determines if you shine. How you stand determines if you will shine. Then what we do matters. Okay? And I want us to practice, right? We're supposed to stand.

0 (4m 52s):

So could everybody stand up for a second? If you're here in person, if you're online, I want you to stand too, even if you're like by yourself in the bus, like stand up for a second, okay? We're standing. Okay, we're standing right? Okay. You guys know what standing means? We're all doing it right now. We're practicing right now. So how you stand to terms if you shine now I want everybody to shine. What? There's a few people doing jazz hands. Okay, what we're like what? What does shine mean? Oh, some people getting out their phones. Oh yeah, there you go. Okay, you guys can have a seat. We're like what does shine means? Well we're gonna learn some of that in this passage, but how you stand determines if you'll shine. So we need to learn how to stand and we're gonna learn three different lessons about how we need to stand in this life now so that we can shine forever and ever in everlasting life.

0 (5m 37s):

So the first thing we're gonna learn if you're taking notes, and if you want you can use the U version Bible app, find our Rise church Denver event. Take notes right there. See the scripture that we're covering today. But the first thing we're gonna learn about how to stand is that one, if you stand firm, you will be saved. If

you stand firm, you will be saved. So let's start Daniel chapter 12 together. We'll start in verse one. If you weren't here, there was this vision Daniel had and then an angel came to him and started telling him about some of the things that were happening. And then things got very violent in the end of chapter 11. Things were very bad.

0 (6m 16s):

And then it says in verse one, at that time, Michael, the great prince by great prince, it means the arc angel. He's one of the top dog angels, a warrior who fights for God's people. Says who protects your people will arise. There will be a time of distress such as has not happened from the beginning of nations until then. So at the very end we'll have an angel fighting for us to protect us. But there's gonna be a time of great distress. The scriptures teach us again and again that towards the end of the world things will get really bad.

0 (6m 56s):

It's this time here called a time of great distress. Some people call it the time of great tribulation, which is an old word that means distress. Okay? Tribulation, trial, conflict, distress. And it'll be a great time. And this last time and and we'll talk about when it's going to be in just a minute cuz that's what everybody wants to know. Well when is that gonna happen? Because everybody thinks it's gonna happen in their lifetime for like 2000 years. Everybody's like it's gonna happen in this generation. Everybody thinks that I, I saw one poll that was like 70% of Christians think that Jesus is gonna return in the next 40 years. Well that's what like 70% of Christians have thought for the last 2000 years. So I don't know, but I do know there will be a time of great distress at the end. Things will get really bad. But as we see in the second half of verse one says, but that at that time your people, God's people, everyone whose name is found written in the book will be delivered.

0 (7m 49s):

The word delivered is a synonym for saved. Those whose name is written in the book of life will be delivered. They will be saved. And that's why I say if you stand firm, you will be saved. Now when we use the word saved here, some people are like, well I thought if if you believe in Jesus, you're saved. Right? But there's also a concept of salvation that it doesn't just begin the moment you believe, but it goes till the very end. And if you are faithful in your belief till the end, then you will also be saved. It's not saying like if you're a good person for the rest of your life and you do enough good works, then you'll be safe. No, no, no. We're staying faith. It's it's faith from first to last. We believe in Jesus Christ and it's that faith that must carry us to the end even through some of the hardest things that might befall us.

0 (8m 37s):

So you're wondering, well when is that? When is this time of great tribulation? We all wanna know, some of you are watching online right now and you're taking notes, you're trying to fit it into your chart. When are the end times coming? Can I smell it in the air? Like is it happening this decade? What's interesting is that there's this one angel that's been talking to Daniel the whole time and now in this chapter we're gonna jump down a little bit. Two more angels show up. And it's interesting cuz they just like appear and they're like, Hey,

one of them even asked like how long is this gonna be? The angels don't even know when the end will be. Did you know that Jesus said that Nobody knows the angels don't know even Jesus in his life here on earth didn't know when the end would be. He said only the father knows.

0 (9m 17s):

So anybody who tells you they know when it's gonna end. They're lying cuz they ain't our father in heaven. You heard me on that. So don't go chasing stupid idiot prophets. Okay? Let's just say that if you were online and you're one of those people, stop it. Repent, okay? Nobody knows the end, even the angels are trying to figure it out. So the angels are like, when is it gonna be? And in the second half of verse seven, we're gonna pick it up as the first main angel starts talking again. He says It will be for a time times and half a time when the power of the holy people has been finally broken, all these things will be completed. So there you go. A time, times and half a time.

0 (9m 59s):

If you're like, what does that mean? That's exactly what Daniel was thinking. Verse eight. He says, I heard but I did not understand. Okay, so if you don't understand this stuff, neither did Daniel, one of the greatest heroes of the Bible, had no clue what this angel was talking about. And he even asked the follow-up question. He says, my Lord, what will be the outcome of all this? Okay, things are gonna get really bad. That's clear How long time? Time. And half of times a lot of people think, well that means one time one plus two plus half. So that's three and a half. So people interpret this as three and a half years. I think there's actually pretty good grounds for that as we'll see in just a moment that this could be a three and a half year period. But when that three and a half year period starts, none of us have any clue.

0 (10m 43s):

So even if we know it's three and a half years, we don't know when it's going to start, but we do know it's gonna end. In verse nine, the angel responds to Daniel and he says, go your way Daniel. Just live your life. Don't worry too much about this stuff because the words are rolled up and sealed until the end of the time, meaning none of this is gonna make sense until the end. And in the book of Revelation they actually open up scrolls in this vision that John has. I wonder if this is the scroll that's opened up. So finally it makes sense, but the angel does tell us what's gonna happen. Verse 10, many will be purified, made, spotless and refined, but the wicked will continue to be wicked and none of the wicked will understand.

0 (11m 29s):

But those who are wise will understand this is what we can understand. Things will get tough, there will be trials, there will be tribulation, there will be distress. And those who are faithful and they stand firm will be refined. When you're refined, that means it's getting rid of all the bad stuff. The sin in your life will be less and less. All the unnecessary things in your life will be less and less when we go through trials and when we go through the great trial at the end you get refined. This is what happens for this time. And then verse 11, the angel says, from the time that the daily sacrifice is abolished and the abomination that causes desolation is

set up, we'll talk about that.

0 (12m 13s):

There will be 1,290 days. Blessed is the one who waits for and reaches the end of the 1,335 days. What as for you go your way until the end. Okay, so 1,290 days if you do the calculation that's somewhere around three and a half years, 1,335 days, that's somewhere around three and a half years in the book of Revelation it actually has another figure. 1,260 days around three and a half years. Now I don't know what happens between 1,260 to 1,290 to 1335, what are those extra 30 and 45 days going on there. But what we see that there's this three and a half year period and certain things are going to happen tr people try to map it out.

0 (12m 56s):

That's what those timelines are there like trying to figure out what event happens at which time and and I don't, I have not been convinced by anybody's timeline. Sorry, we don't know and we probably won't know it's sealed up until the end then it will be clear. But what we do know is that there will be a hard time at the end, a hard trial, but it will come to an end. And three and a half years is a long time when you're living through it. But it comes to an end. Just think about this, what happened three years ago this week? Anybody remember three years ago? Oh my gosh, Tom Hanks got Covid 19 in Australia. Do you remember this? The N B A shut down and one of the most pivotal things arise church Denver was not meeting that Sunday.

0 (13m 38s):

If you guys remember that. A lot of you weren't even a part of our church then, right? We weren't meeting in person, we were online only. And oh my gosh, our world got upended. That was three years ago. For how many people does that feel more than three years ago? Anybody? Some people are like, no, it feels like yesterday. Anybody, when you raise your hand if like it like has distorted our sense of time, hasn't it? These last three years. And it has felt like a long time in a lot of different ways. Like when are we gonna open up? When are we gonna stop wearing masks? When is this virus gonna stop going on? When are our kids gonna be back to school? Do you remember all these things? And we're waiting and, and that trial, it seemed to go on forever, but it's three years later and it's three years later and we're like, okay, we made it through.

0 (14m 21s):

You guys made it through. All right guys, good job. You can give yourself a round of applause. We've made it through some of you're like, no, it's still going on. Okay, I'm not trying to debate that right now. Maybe in the next half of years we'll get over it. But I'm saying this it, there's like a 1,260 period, a 1200 in 90 day period and then a 1,335 day period. And I say that because it's interesting cause some people are like, oh, just gotta get to the finish line and then there's another finish line and then another finish line, another 45 days, another 30 days. And when you're going through something awful in life, man, that's the worst, right? But it's that waiting and pushing forward when you make it to the top of the mountain and then there's, oh my gosh, it's a false summit. We gotta climb even higher, right? That's what trials feel like in our life and maybe this great trial will be the greatest example, but whether it's small trials in our life or the final trial, we have to

stand firm and keep pushing forward.

0 (15m 11s):

And it might feel like, oh my gosh, it's been going on so long, but God has limited the time for your trial. If you are right now in a trial, it is going to end. God has already written the future, your trial will come to the end. I don't know if it will be 30 more days, 45 more days, three more years, decades more. But it will come to an end. God has already written it. So stand firm, let nothing move. You always stay firm on Jesus because everything's gonna push you away from that. Stop believing your God isn't gonna come true. He he, he's not even real. He doesn't listen to prayers and maybe if he is real, he doesn't love you. Okay? That's the the thoughts that are gonna go through your head. That's what the things are gonna be told to you by other people.

0 (15m 51s):

And many will go astray when things get really bad at the end when it's illegal to follow Jesus. When people are persecuting us to, to the level that's going on in China or North Korea right now, like when that happens to us, we're gonna be like many will fall away, but we must stand firm no matter what comes at you, stand firm and you will be saved. So if you just got that diagnosis, stand firm, if you just heard about someone you love dying stand firm, you will make it through the grief. If you are struggling right now, you lost your job stand firm, let nothing move you.

0 (16m 31s):

If you stand firm, you will be saved. How you stand determines if you shine tracking with me on this and it's standing firm till the end standing firm to the end Some, some people are like this abomination and desolation. What is this even talking about? Is that what happened with Antiochus Epiphanous when they set up a statue of Zeus in the temple and sacrificed to pig? Remember we talking about that a few weeks ago? What Jesus tells us is actually this is probably something that's going to happen again in the future. Might have happened in 1 67 bc but it's also gonna happen in the future. I'm gonna show you this in Matthew chapter 24, verse 15. Jesus says, so when you see standing in the holy place, the abomination that causes desolation spoken of through the prophet Daniel, so did you know what Jesus believed?

0 (17m 19s):

Everything Daniel said. Okay? So if Jesus believes it, I follow Jesus. I believe him. Okay, A and and what is he talking about? Verse 21 of Matthew. For then there will be great distress, sound familiar, unequal from the beginning of the world until now and never to be equaled again. See, Jesus believed this stuff. He knew it was coming and we need to stand firm. In fact, that's what he says elsewhere in that chapter, in verses 12 and 13 of Matthew 24, Jesus says this, because of the increase of wickedness, the love of most will grow cold. See that word most, most of Jesus' followers, their love for him will grow cold.

0 (17m 60s):

They will not stand firm. Don't let that be said of you. Don't let your faith, your love for God grow cold and say, oh my gosh, things are too hard. I, I can't believe I can't make it through this. Don't do it. But Jesus says, the one who stands what the one who stands firm to the end will be saved. That's where I got my point number one. In case you're wondering, those are the words of Jesus. The one who stands firm to the end will be saved. You have to make it through and that's what it's going to take. Your faith is going to be tested in a trial and we have to stand firm to the end and it's those who do who will be saved. So that's the first thing. If you stand firm, you will be saved and it's till the end whenever that is.

0 (18m 41s):

Now, back on September 6th, 1995, there was one of the greatest games of baseball ever played. And it wasn't because the Baltimore Orioles beat the California Angels four two, that that's not why. It's because of somebody who was playing in that game. Because in the fifth inning of that game, when the game is officially considered by, by baseball rules, a full game, Cal Ripkin Jr. Had just broken Luke Eric's record and had played his 2131st consecutive game.

0 (19m 21s):

That's impressive. And Cal Ripkin Jr. After they got to the fifth inning, people started standing to cheer for him because this record had been standing for over 40 years that nobody had played that many games in a row. That's a lot of games in a row o over a decade he's playing game after game, after game, through injury, through hurt, through weather. No matter what's coming up, he keeps at it, right? He's standing firm and he keeps playing. So when people stood up in the fifth inning to start cheering for him, they started yelling, cheering, applauding our president, bill Clinton at the time was there standing and applauding Cal Rippin Jr. So he went out and and waved to the crowd and they kept cheering and then he went back into the dugout.

0 (20m 1s):

Anybody remember this game? And then they, they pushed him back out because everybody was still cheering. This happened multiple times. Finally, he did a victory lap, tried to go back in and people are still cheering for 22 minutes. He received a standing ovation, not because he was the best hitter or had made a great play or hitter home run, he could do all those things, but because he stuck with it, this is maybe the greatest record that will ever stand in baseball. And people think nobody will ever beat it just because he showed up every day and kept going. That's why he was applauded. So let me tell you this, we've gotta stand firm so that we can receive the applause at the end so we can hear the voice of the father saying, well done, good and faithful servant stand firm.

0 (20m 50s):

And I think there are some people going through a trial right now now who need some encouragement. They're on the brink right now. They're like, I don't know if I can keep going. And they're here in our midst, they're watching online and I think we need to give them some applause, don't you? So let's stand up and let's give an applause to those who keep going, who are standing faithful. Let's do it. Keep at it. Keep moving, keep moving forward. Stand firm. Let nothing move you. Okay? You guys can have, we don't have to do that for 22 minutes. We gotta stand firm and then you'll be saved. That's the first point we learn from Daniel chapter 12.

0 (21m 32s):

The second one is that if you stand with Jesus, you'll receive eternal life. We don't just stand firm. We need to stand firm believing and trusting in Jesus. Because when you stand with him, that's what's going to determine whether you will have everlasting life with him forever. The angel speaks to Daniel in 13. And I want to to finish out this chapter and then we're gonna go back to the, the beginning because I, I love the words of the beginning of this chapter. Second half of verse 13, the angel says, you will rest Daniel and then at the end of the days you will rise to receive your allotted inheritance. What he's telling Daniel, this faithful man who is now in his eighties, who has been faithful to God through slavery, through King Nene, through who knows what kind of abuse may be even forced to become a eunich, what history tells us through decades of that he's faithful and still he will not see the end in this life.

0 (22m 30s):

And that's why the angel says, you're gonna die, you're gonna rest, but at the end you will rise. There will be a resurrection. You will see the last day when you have eternal life. This is what God makes so clear through this angel that's speaking to Daniel. Let, let's jump back to the beginning in, in chapter 12, we're jump gonna jump down the second half of verse one. I wanna start there again and then we're gonna look at two. The angel says, but at that time, at the end, your people, everyone whose name is found written in the book will be delivered. And verse two says, multitudes who sleep in the dust of the earth will awake some to everlasting life, others to shame and everlasting contempt.

0 (23m 17s):

The multitudes means every human being who has died. This is Daniel, this is David, this is Joseph, this is Paul, this is even Billy Graham. These guys are faithful, right? These are the people we love who have passed on. Everyone who will rise at the end and then some will rise to everlasting life and some to everlasting shame and contempt. There are two different paths, two different places that people will go, one or the other. There's not different options. You don't get to choose. You don't be like, well I kind of want to go in the middle ground. Like there are only two options. The scriptures are abundantly clear. This is the clearest place in the Old Testament.

0 (23m 57s):

But Jesus says that over and over again. He says, okay, there's a wide path. Many go on it. There's a big broad gate. Many enter through destruction that way. But then there's a small path with a narrow gate that leads to life and only a few find it. Jesus talks about these two paths. There's there's no other options. And nowhere in the Bible, I'm sorry to break it to you there, is there a place called purgatory that that is not taught in the Bible anywhere. In fact, we are taught very clearly in Hebrews 9 27 says this, it is appointed for people to die once and after this judgment, you die and then judgment.

0 (24m 39s):

You don't so work off your sins in the next life. That is not from the Bible. I'm, I'm sorry to break it to you. And I know some of you are even taught that by your church. It's not in the Bible anywhere. Instead we're taught over and over again. There are two paths. And what you do decide now, where you stand today determines your destiny then. And if you stand with Jesus here, you will have eternal life then is tracking with me on this? Daniel would be raised to life. Did you know that we as followers of Jesus look forward to that last resurrection. A lot of people think, oh, it's when you die and your soul leaves your body and you get to float around in heaven. Okay? Paul does say that to be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord.

0 (25m 23s):

Like that's clear. Jesus said that to the, to the person on the cross next to him. He believed in that moment even though he was a criminal. Okay, that's a good nose for you and I, okay? And Jesus said, today you'll be with me in paradise. We will go to paradise. But what we actually look forward to as followers of Jesus is the end where there will be a resurrection of our bodies and we will get to live and reign on the new heavens and the new earth that have combined. And we get to live forever where there'll be no more sickness, sorrow, pain or death to ran on this planet forever. And here's another thing, I'm gonna burst some people's bubbles. You don't get to become an angel. You don't, you don't. Now maybe we'll get wings like that would be cool.

0 (26m 3s):

I don't know. Jesus kind of flew up into the air. But what we do know is that we'll be better than angels. I think people who think they're gonna become angels, you're aiming too low. That's what the book of Hebrews teaches us. Like Jesus became lower the an than the angels while he was here on earth as a human being and then became higher to them. It says that we will judge angels, followers of Jesus. We're higher than the angels, okay? What we look forward to is something so much greater in eternal life and and that is only available for those who stand with Jesus. Now because it said those whose names are written in the book of life, it doesn't say those who are good people.

0 (26m 46s):

It doesn't say those who have been faithful to go to church every single week. It doesn't say those who have tithed, it doesn't say those who have been baptized. It doesn't even say those who have raised their hand and said the sinner's prayer. It says those whose names are written in the book. Jesus said that too when his disciples were casting out demons for the first time. They're like, look at us. Jesus says, don't rejoice that the demons listen to you, rejoice that your names are written in heaven. And in the book of Revelation we're told the name of this book, the title of it, the Lamb's Book of Life. Because the lamb is Jesus who died as a sacrificial lamb in our place at the end, there will be a book that's open.

0 (27m 27s):

We're told this at the very end of revolution. There's a book that's open that has all your deeds that you've ever done. And that's what people are judged on. The people who go to everlasting shame and contempt deserve it. They have done things in their life and they have chosen to live apart from God in this life. And they're gonna choose it in eternity. And every single one of us, when that first book is open, we'll be sad. Like uhoh. Like, how did I do that? Yes, you're right. I I sh didn't do the good things I should have done. I own some sin. But then there's a second book and it's that second book that gives us hope because the only thing that matters is, is your name written in it. You might be the worst person in the world, but your name is open up because I put my faith in Jesus.

0 (28m 7s):

I've put my trust in Jesus. And your name is written in the book and it's like you're in, you're in. It's like you're going to the club and you're like, ah, I'm not famous enough. I'm not rich enough to get into this club. The the bouncer's like, oh you know the owner you're in. Right? That's what it's gonna be like if your name is written in the book of life. That's what matters. And that's why we must stand with Jesus. And and we are told clearly by Jesus that whoever believes in me has crossed over from death to life. Paul says, whoever calls on the name of the Lord will be saved. If you put your faith in Jesus, that's all it takes. Your name is written down, you're in. So where we stand now and how we stand determines if will shine.

0 (28m 48s):

So stand with Jesus. Now, I do wanna make that even more clear that if you don't stand with Jesus, the corollary of this is that you will stand in shame forever. That's what it says, shame. Because it's not a good place to be. It's not gonna feel good. It's contempt. And that that's what we call hell. And Jesus talked about hell more than anyone else in the entire Bible. 12% of all his teaching and half of all his parables talked about hell in judgment. Why? Cuz he didn't want people to go there. It's a place of suffering. It's a place of torment forever and ever. And sadly people choose it. Sadly. People choose it.

0 (29m 29s):

And and and I think CS Lewis is right when he says that the gates of hell are locked from the inside. Because if people in this life hear about Jesus and they know they're doing wrong and they still say, no, no, no, I'd rather do it my way than God's way, why would they then want to spend eternity with God? Like it doesn't make any sense. The people who in this life are like, I'm not gonna follow God, are not gonna want to do it on the other side of eternity. It's going to continue. That's why the gates of Heller lock from the inside. People often wonder like, well how could a good loving God send people to hell? That's the wrong question. How could people choose to go to hell instead of obey a good in loving God?

0 (30m 12s):

That's the real question. I don't know. I don't get it because hell is hot and eternity is a long time. And yet people choose it again and again. And most people choose it rather than declare that Jesus is their Lord and

Savior. So how we stand now determines our eternal destiny. And that's so important. GK Chesterton, if we pull up this, says that hell is God's great compliment to the reality of human freedom and the dignity of human choice. God lets us make our choice. So some of you here today have not put your faith in Jesus. You're listening to my voice and you haven't stood with Jesus and say, I'm I stand with him.

0 (30m 54s):

This is critical for you to think about because your choice now determines your eternity then am I clear enough? I clear enough. You gotta stand with Jesus now. And even more than that, we need to stand to help others follow Jesus. That's our third point. Stand to help others follow Jesus. And then you'll shine like the stars.
