### 0 (1s):

All right. It is time to think bigger, to pray bigger, and to believe bigger. And that's what we're challenging you to do through these 21 Days of Prayer. Thank you Mike for that video. And I do just wanna encourage you, we're doing these 21 Days of Prayer and fasting here as a church. Hopefully you've been doing both those things. Fasting from something and just making a deliberate effort to Prayer. And I hope that you guys have signed up for our Prayer texts, If. you guys been getting those in the morning? We had a lot of people sign up Next week. But If, you miss that. You can use this QR code behind me or text the word Prayer to 8 3 3 2 5 2 8 6 1 8. And I know for some of you, getting those at 6:00 AM is so early, but maybe that's just God's nudge to wake you up. Okay? Wake up and pray. Start your day outright.

# 0 (42s):

This is just a great way for us as a church to be praying together and, and believing even bigger. So if you're newish to our church, we want to get to know you. So I actually have a, a QR code behind me for this. Arise Denver dot com slash new. You can go there as well. Please fill out this new form. If you're joining online or in person and you're new-ish to our church, we actually give \$5 to the Denver Rescue Mission for every single one of those new forms that gets filled out because we wanna get to know you, And, we wanna help you follow Jesus. That's our mission here. That's our mission. And by the way, My name ISS Matt. Wolf. 'cause If, you're new. You don't know who I am. So now you know my name's Matt Wolf, I'm the lead pastor here. And then we have a special thing today. This is our second Sunday, and we're gonna try doing this every month. Now, on our second Sunday of the month, we're gonna have second Sunday start. So right after the service, if you're newish, just come to the front.

## 0 (1m 24s):

Katie, our connections director and Pastor Sawyer are gonna be up here. And. we would just love to, to connect with you, get to know you a little bit. This is a great chance to just find out a little bit more about our church for five minutes. You guys can stick around for five extra minutes, right? That'll be good. Well, today we are going to continue our Ga god size series for week two of God size, week two, because we do want to expand your mind. So last week, I really challenged you to think bigger, to pray bigger, to believe bigger, because you're not asking God for big enough stuff. And that was the challenge last week in a message called When God Is Too Small, today's message is called When. God is Too Big, because I think for some of us, God is so big, and if he's the, the creator of the universe and he's out there And, we can't see him, and there's 8 billion people on the planet trying to talk to him, like, should I really bring this thing and pray about that thing?

#### 0 (2m 12s):

Like it, it seems like my thing is way too small for this big God. So I'm gonna challenge you guys today that, that maybe God is, is someone who cares about the small things. And nothing is too small. Nothing is too insignificant for God. I think a lot of us have a false view of who God is. Last year we hosted a conference here at our church. We're part of a movement of churches with about 1600 churches around the country and called Converge Worldwide. And in our region, we hosted our regional conference for, for Utah, Colorado,

and Wyoming So. we had all sorts of church leaders from that region here in our building, which was really cool to host that some of you guys volunteered thank you for helping.

### 0 (2m 54s):

And our, the, the main speaker at, at our regional conference was the president of Converge. He was a new incoming president, and his name is Dr. John Jenkins. And If, you don't know who he is, he is the senior pastor of probably, I don don't know either the biggest or one of the biggest African American churches in the entire country. Over 40,000 people in his church. And he leads this movement of churches over 1600 churches. He's one of the greatest preachers alive today. If, you haven't heard him. He's just an incredible preacher. And he preached a couple times. And then after the, his second session preaching at this conference, he came up and talked with me for a little bit. We were the host church. And he said, Hey, can I get your contact info? I was like, sure, yeah, you can have my contact card. So I shared my contact card and he's like, oh, and here's mine.

#### 0 (3m 35s):

And I was like, whoa, okay. Here's this guy. He's pretty important, okay? He sits on boards for organizations that are real big, you know, he's the president of converged 1600 40,000 people in his church. Look up to him as pastor, and I have his personal cell phone number now. So since last March, how many times do you think I've called and texted him Big goose egg, right? Because I'm like, I, I might have his personal cell phone number, but I don't wanna bother him unless it's something really important, right? I I wanna have really thought through it before I just shoot him a text and say, Hey, what's up, dude? Okay, I, it needs to be important. It needs to be significant. And I think that's the same view that most of us have of God, that he's big, he's important.

# 0 (4m 17s):

I mean, there's wars going on right now. There's people in in Gaza and Ukraine crying out to him in Burma, okay? My little thing when I'm standing in the, the line at Starbucks, like my little thing is not that big. And I think that's how we feel. My my thing is too small. My thing is too insignificant for this big God. So I'm gonna challenge you to today that yes, our God is big. He's huge, he can do the impossible. And yet he also cares about each one of us individually and wants to hear our small, seemingly insignificant prayers. I think this idea of, of God, I I think it's bad theology, but it was portrayed pretty well in a movie a few years ago by Jim Carrey called Bruce Almighty. Do you remember this?

### 0 (4m 57s):

And Bruce Almighty, of course, Jim Carrey is, is playing God. And as he's playing God, he's like trying to listen to everybody's prayers and he's distracted and he, he can't quite organize it. So first he tries, you know, with a file system and there's files everywhere, like there's too many prayers to handle. Then he tries sticky notes and they're over everything. And then finally he is like, okay, maybe I'll just send it over email. Do you guys remember this scene? And there's millions and millions of emails coming in, and the more he

answers, more emails keep piling up. I think that's how a lot of us think of God. Like he's too busy and like he can't handle all these different things. So my little thing isn't worth bothering God with, but that is false. That is not true. Our God cares, he loves us and he wants to have a relationship with us.

### 0 (5m 42s):

So I'm gonna challenge you today, actually, I'm gonna invite you into this relationship with God, because nothing is too small, nothing is too insignificant for our God. So we are gonna learn about this from one story of the Bible that you might not know, or if you've read it, you might've like, what the heck was that about you? It's a very bad act story if I'd say so myself. And you'll see what I'm talking about in a minute as we open up two kings, chapter six, So, if you have your Bible open with me to two kings, chapter six. We're gonna be in verses one through seven today. And If, you have the, the Bible app on your phone, the YouVersion Bible app. Go ahead and find the event and find a rice church Denver.

### 0 (6m 23s):

You can save the, the scripture and the notes from today's message right there. And, and we're gonna learn two points from this story. And they're related. And the first one is this, very simple. Nothing is too big for God, or I'm sorry, nothing is too small for God. I said it in reverse. Okay? I'm glad you guys are paying attention. Nothing is too small for God. You see, you got that 0.1, nothing is too small for God. Okay? So let's read in two kings, chapter six, verse one. It says, the company of the prophets said to Elisha, look, the place where we meet with you is too small for us. Let us go to the Jordan, the river, where each of us can get a pole and let us build a place there for us to meet.

# 0 (7m 4s):

And he said, go. Okay. So what's going on in this story? So here's Elijah. This is not Elijah. A lot of us have heard of Elijah, the great prophet, Elijah was the guy who took over from Elijah. And Elijah had had asked, Hey, you know, Elijah had performed these great miracles, fire coming down from heaven. And he said, Hey, could I have a double portion? And God gave it to him. So he actually performed some greater miracles in the Bible, some of the coolest miracles of the Old Testament that he performed. So he was like the head prophet, the head senior pastor, right? And here are these other prophets that kinda work for him. They're, they're the associate pastors. And, and they're learning from him that that, and probably because there's all these people coming under Elisha, he's awesome performing these miracles.

# 0 (7m 46s):

They're like, Hey, there's too many of us. We can't meet in the same building. We've been meeting So. we need to build a new building. Okay? This is a pretty simple thing, but this happens. This is probably gonna happen to a arise church at some point, that we're gonna outgrow this building just giving you guys a heads up. So I'm gonna send you guys all down to the river to get some poles, right? Okay? No, maybe figuratively, that's what we're gonna do, because together we're gonna have to, you know, build something even bigger. But that's what they're doing at this stage. They're building something bigger, and they're going down to chop

down some trees. Verse three, we continue the story, it says, then one of them said, won't you please come with your servants, I will. Elisha replied, and he went with them.

# 0 (8m 26s):

They went to the Jordan and began to cut down trees. What a fascinating start to a story, right? Here's these group of dudes going to chop down some trees to build a building. Now, they asked Elisha to go with them, and don don't think they asked him because he was like some great Bronny, you know, woodsman, okay? Although he might've been very strong before he became a prophet, he was actually out plowing in the fields. Maybe, you remember this story when Elijah called him to come follow, and, and so he was strong, he was a hard worker. But by this point, he's the head guy. He's the top dog. He's delegating to them to do this work of building. This is their idea. They should be the one working, but he goes with them. And I point that out because in these stories, the prophet represents God.

### 0 (9m 11s):

Prophet is the spokesperson for God speaking on behalf of God. And Elisha as the top main prophet, he represents God in this story. And we'll see this actually pretty clearly pretty soon. So these guys are saying, Hey, we want to build a new building. So we're just asking God to come with us, God, to bless us in this endeavor of chopping down woods. We want him to be involved from the beginning. They're asking him to, to be involved with this project. And then in verse five, we continue reading. As one of them was cutting down a tree, the iron ax said, fell into the water. Oh no, my Lord, he cried out it was borrowed.

#### 0 (9m 55s):

Verse six, the man of God asked, well, where did it fall? What a riveting story. Okay, this is a page turner, right? You're like, what? These guys are chopping down trees and one of 'em has a bad axe. Hence the bad axe story. I told you guys, right? And the head flies off into the river. Has this ever happened to any of you? If, you've had an ax, you lost the ax accent. I'm the only one who's had it happen When I was in college, okay, maybe I saw one other hand, I, that was college, the ax head went the other way and went right into my leg. Okay? Don't tell my parents, my dad's here, but he heard it anyways. And I didn't, you know, I didn't know what I was doing, taking care of myself in college. It was bad, right? 'cause If, you have a bad axe, like the, the head flies off. Okay?

# 0 (10m 35s):

What a dumb little story. Okay? When we're talking about Elisha here, there are times where he takes a poisoned lake and turns it into freshwater so people can live. There are times where he multiplies food, okay? You thought just Jesus did that. Elisha did it first, okay? Elisha even brought back a boy from death, resurrected him. He turned a widow widow's oil when she was about to starve to death and made it multiply so she could survive her and her family, like the miracle after miracle, crazy, cool miracles. And then we come to an accent falling in the river. Why would God put that story in here? You know, there is no story and certainly no word of the Bible that's in here on accident.

### 0 (11m 20s):

I want you guys to know this, okay? Every word of God is breathed out by him. The Holy Spirit carried along the authors of the scriptures to write down exactly what, what God wanted to convey to us. And if all scriptures God breathed, why would he tell us this story about an accent falling in the river? It seems so small and insignificant, but look how this person responds when the axed falls in the river. He says, oh no, my Lord. Oh no, this is just an exclamation. And he says it was borrowed. Does he ask Elisha to do anything?

# 0 (12m 0s):

He doesn't. I I find that so fascinating. It says, the man of God asks, and, and do you notice how it calls Elisha the man of God here? That's why I'm saying Elisha represents God. So here he is, he loses his head and he just exclaims. Oh, no, Maybe, you could think of another word after o that you might say after something like that, right? And so this is just an exclamation coming up out of him, right? He's upset, he's angry, he's crying out. And the person who represents God in this story says, Hey, what can I do to help? Johnny Erickson once said that There is nothing that moves a, a loving father's soul, quite like his child's cry.

### 0 (12m 40s):

What I love about this is there's not even a, an ask here, there's just a, ah, there's a burden. That there's an anguish, there's an anxiety, a worry. There's, there's something going on that he, he's like, oh, no, what am I gonna, how am I gonna return this ax head? And he just cries out to God. You know, God is a loving father and he wants to help his children. I know this too, because my kids, you know, we're, we're working on them to teach them to, to use their words, right? But, but a lot of times they get frustrated, something, ah, ah, you can just hear 'em, right? And I'm like, okay, use your words to tell me what's going on. but I come over and I want to help them. Even just that exclamation that cry brings me over to want to help them, okay?

# 0 (13m 23s):

And that's what God does for us, because nothing is too small for God. Nothing is too small for him. He wants us to, to bring those. Even when we don't know what to ask for, we're just like, oh, no. God hears that and he cares. In fact, in Romans chapter eight, Paul tells us that the Holy Spirit inside of us, even if we have wordless groans, we don't even know what to say. God hears it. The Holy Spirit takes that from our heart to the very ear of our Father in heaven. And as a loving father, he cares. He wants to help. So this means we can have those childlike prayers. Help. Ah, that's a Prayer. If it's directed up to God, if it jerked it up to God, we can pray for very little things.

### 0 (14m 10s):

You guys heard about Bobby, right? He's a 10-year-old Bobby. He was going with his dad to McDonald's. And on the way there, there was an accident up ahead, and they heard the ambulance speeding by him. And, and as was his habit, Bobby's dad said, okay, let's stop and pray. So Bobby in the backseat says, God, please don't let that accident block our way to McDonald's, because isn't that what, what kids pray for? That kind of stuff, right? I want my cheeseburger, okay? And And, we can have those kind of prayers with our father in heaven. He cares about us enough to answer what seems to us as small prayers. In Colossians chapter one, verse 17, we read, Christ, God's Son was before all things, and all things are held together by him.

### 0 (15m 1s):

If, if Jesus is the one who holds all things together, this means that yes, he holds together gravity, So, we have gravity that holds us to our planet. So. we don't float off in the outer space. He, he gives us, you know, the strength in our bones. He sustains us. But, but if he does those things, like with making the universe sustained, if he holds all those things, it includes all the small things too, the tiny things. It's not just big gigantic things that God cares about, it's also the small things that are held together by Jesus. And that's why Jesus taught us to pray this way. Do you remember this in the Lord's Prayer, in Matthew six 11, he taught us to pray. Give us today our daily bread.

# 0 (15m 42s):

What a small Prayer. What a tiny Prayer. For most of us, we have bread in, in our refrigerator, If, you keep it in the refrigerator, maybe in the microwave. Who keeps the bread in the microwave? Okay, you got bread, Maybe, you can just go to the store. If, you don't have any bread. It's not that big of a deal. But yet we're still taught to pray. Give us today our daily bread. Such a simple thing that we need every single day. We need some food. And yet Jesus wants us to pray that He also teaches us, get this, that our father in heaven knows what we need before we ask. Have you ever thought about this? Then why do we pray? Well, it's for us to develop a relationship with our father in heaven.

# 0 (16m 25s):

He wants to communicate to us. He, this is an invitation. Hey, invite me into the small things. I wanna be a part of your life. I care about you. I love you because I'm a loving father. I wanna know the little things that are going on in your day. I want to talk with you about what foods you're eating. Don't just come to me with the big stuff. Please come with those things, those honor God. But even the small things honor God too. So bring your small prayers to God. JP Morland, he's a professor at Biola, a a brilliant guy. And he wrote a book called, I'll Remember it in just a minute. It's about miracles.

#### 0 (17m 5s):

It's very good. And he, he wrote this book and he tells a little story about his daughters. He had two daughters. And one day they came to him and said, dad, our basement is really big. We want a pool table. And he said, well, that's expensive. That's not in our budget. It's not gonna happen. Right? And he thought he would put that idea to rest. And they said, well, could we pray about it? And he is like, okay, well he's a Christian professor. He is like, okay, fine, we can, we can do this. So they sat around in a circle held hands, and each of the girls prayed. And then it was his turn to pray and he, he wanted to make sure that he was

very clear with God. He said, God, give us a free pool table that we don't have to pay for, and it needs to be really nice one like they have at the sports bar.

# 0 (17m 49s):

Okay, free pool table. That was really nice. Okay? So he kind of forgot about it. And, and his daughter, Allison was on a, a new baseball team. There were all new parents on there. He didn't know anybody on the team. And, and two weeks later he was at one of the games and one of the other dads who he had never talked to one time came over and started talking to him. And a couple minutes in after the, the small talk said, Hey, do you want a pool table? So JP was like, what, what is going on? And and the guy said, well, you know, I, I own a home. And I was renting it out to four college guys and, and they bought this really nice pool table from a sports bar.

### 0 (18m 29s):

And then they stopped paying rent. So I had to evict him. And now I got a pool table and I don't want it. So JP was like, why would you come to me? There's all these parents, you've never met me. You don't know me from Adam. Why would you come to me and ask if I want this pool table? And he said, well, you know, I'm a follower of Jesus and I just felt the Holy Spirit tell me to go offer you this free pool table. Isn't that amazing? Just a simple Prayer for a pool table. God hears in answers, And. You might think, well, why would God care about that kind of stuff? Well, well, he figured out a little bit later, JP realized that their two girls were becoming teenagers and they wanted their teenagers and their friends to hang out at their house where it was safer.

### 0 (19m 13s):

And they realized that having that pool table in the basement made that happen more and more, that their house became the cool place for the teenagers to hang out. So even though these girls, it seemed like a very small Prayer that he didn't even want to pray, right? Turned out to something bigger that God used for his purposes. And that's what he does. So what small things are you asking God for? Are you inviting him into, could you invite him into your home too? Okay, Maybe, you need a pool table. Start asking a hot tub. I I could pray for a hot tub, right? Because maybe God could use it. You know, there, here's a cool thing. This is a little plug for you. God can use your house, your couch for his kingdom. And I'm gonna challenge you because we need some people to step up to lead community groups, okay?

# 0 (19m 58s):

So, if you have a home, you have a couch, you have an apartment, Maybe, you don't Maybe, you should start praying for that. So God can use it. Maybe, you can meet here at the church. We're actually, Katie and I are our new connections director. We're praying for 20 new leaders, 20 new leaders to lead community groups this year. And if you're like, whoa, that's a lot. Yes it is. And if you're thinking, oh, somebody else is gonna feel led, I'm not sure about me. No, there's still not enough. We need 20 So. we need you too. Okay, So, we need people And, we have a little QR code. You can talk with KDF in the service as well. But fill this

out. If you're like, Hey, I could use my living room, I could use my couch, my front porch, or I have a computer or a phone, I can go online. I talked with an amazing couple that's been joining us every week online from New Jersey. Hello. If you're watching from New Jersey, we love you.

# 0 (20m 38s):

Okay? And, and they wanna be a part of an online group, So, we need online community groups as well. 'cause we all need community, don't we? So we're looking for 20 new people to step up. So maybe you're feeling led by God. And if you're like, well Matt, I don't feel like I have a great living space, start asking, right? Because maybe God can use those small prayers for something really big. Start asking, start praying for God to show you where your keys are. Anybody pray that Prayer God, where am my lost keys? Okay? You can even pray that God would give you a top that matches your boots. Okay? Why not involve him in the small things? Ask for those things because God cares.

### 0 (21m 21s):

So our first point is that nothing is too small for God. And the second one is that nothing is too insignificant for God. Nothing is too insignificant. So look what happens next in our story. This axed flies in. Elisha says, okay, where did the axed fall? I didn't see where it splashed. And in verse six, it says, when he showed him the place, Elisha cut a stick and threw it there and made the iron float lifted out. He said, then the man reached out his hand and took it. End of story. A miracle happens with an ax head.

# 0 (22m 1s):

It's so insignificant, right? I mean, it was probably a little more significant than today because there was like no Home Depot that he could just go run down and get a new accent. He couldn't like go on Amazon like, Hey, can we get this overnighted? Okay. It wasn't like that. It would've been a little harder to get an accent. But there's no other accent stories in the entire Bible. Like, this is not like a, a big deal. This is a small insignificant deal to us. And yet God purposely included that in his scriptures for us. John Newton wrote a little Diddy about this story. He says this, not one concern of ours is small. If we belong to him to teach us this, the Lord of all once made the iron to swim isn't that good.

#### 0 (22m 46s):

He's trying to teach us something important that nothing is too insignificant for God because he cares about us. He loves us. He's the Father. He will help his kid find that hidden lost thing. Like I looked all over for some Legos yesterday, right? 'cause the dad will do that for their kid. And our father in heaven wants to do that for us. Nothing is too insignificant for, for him. Nothing's too insignificant. I have prayed. I can't tell you how many times where I've done a presentation, I'm like, God, make this projector work. Okay? Right? When I was in school, God, make this paper print. Okay, I need this printer to work today with those small prayers. Why not ask God to, to, to do these things? It might seem insignificant to other people, but they're not to God. He cares.

#### 0 (23m 28s):

In Matthew 10, Jesus teaches us about how much God cares. Jesus says this are not two sparrows, the smallest of birds sold for a penny, the smallest of coins. Yet not one of them will fall to the ground outside your father's care. And even the very hairs on your head are all numbered. So don't be afraid. You are worth more than many sparrows. God knows every hair on your head. He knows the hairs that aren't there anymore, the hairs that have turned gray. And he cares about you. He loves you, and he wants the best for you. John Wesley, the the great preacher once said that nothing is so small or insignificant in the sight of men as not to be an object of the care and providence of God before whom nothing is small that concerns the happiness of any of his creatures.

#### 0 (24m 23s):

Nothing is too insignificant for God. Nothing is too small for him. He cares. He cares about those little things. And I would say this, you might annoy other people with your little prayers, but you won't annoy God. I know this because you've been in one of these community groups or Prayer circles and If. you haven't, you'll, you'll know what I'm talking about someday. Or maybe it's you and there's somebody who prays for things and they're like, my dog has sniffles. God, please heal my little doggy. And I'm like, sniffles again. Or they'll pray for their fathers brothers second cousin, first time removed, former roommates, you know, gout.

#### 0 (25m 7s):

And you're like, come on. Right? You know what I'm talking about? There was a woman in our church growing up. I I loved, we loved her. But man, every time, you know, we did this in the Prayer service every week or in the, in the church service, there would be a time for Prayer. Anybody could pray. You guys know what I'm talking about. There's a reason why we don't do that here. Okay? The one woman she capitalized on that time, like, and I'm just like, oh my gosh, praying for this again, this little thing. But God has never thought that other people might think that. Me and my selfishness think that, but God doesn't think that God loves our little prayers, our small things, the things that burden us, burden him because he loves us.

#### 0 (25m 47s):

So don't feel like you're, you're too, you're making, he's too busy for you. He sure he, he's handling wars and famines and earthquakes, but he also cares about the little things in your life. And our God is powerful enough and all knowing enough to handle it. He doesn't need a filing system or sticky notes. He, he doesn't need a computer system. His brain is greater and more vast than we could ever imagine. He can handle our small things, our insignificant things. So take them to him. Bring the little things to him. And in order to teach you guys this, I came up with a big idea that I think you guys are gonna remember, because I'm putting it to a little Diddy, that those of you who are millennials will know exactly what I'm talking about.

#### 0 (26m 29s):

A little blink, 180 2 goes like this. All the small things, God cares, God sees, okay, gen X, gen Z. You're like, what is that song? Okay, 1999, that song came out. Alright? Okay. So I want you guys to remember this. All

the small things, God cares, God sees. So we're gonna sing it together. Can you guys sing that with me? I wanna hear you guys real loud here. Okay, ready, set. God, the small things, God cares, God sees. I think we need to do that again. Okay, one more time. All the small things God cares.

# 0 (27m 11s):

God sees say it ain't so. Oh my gosh. Oh, that was good. You guys are gonna remember that one, right? I hope so. I I want this to stick in your head. So, so as you start your day in the morning, you invite God into it. As, as you go into the office, you're asking God, Hey, what what do you want me to see today? They can be an exclamation, it can be an ask. And sometimes it's just like, God, hey, this is kind of annoying me, my boss again, just tell him, invite him into that situation. Ask him like, Hey God, what do you want me to do today? I'm unsure. Or is there something new for me? And when you invite him into those little moments, those seemingly insignificant moments, it'll be amazing what God can do through you.

### 0 (27m 53s):

And to illustrate this, there's a couple from our church, Matt and Molly Smith. They come to the early service and they are avid runners. And they actually had a film produced about them as runners. And it's really cool. It's a, a, a film by a a another church in Englewood or here in town in Englewood called The Sacred Grace. And it's a really cool film. So we're gonna watch a clip of it. And If, you wanna watch the full film? We have the link in the YouVersion Bible app today. So let's watch this little clip about Matt and Molly Smith.

# 2 (28m 25s):

For me, running has always been a place of solace. I would say. I came to running before I came to faith. It would focus me on just like I need to go and get my head straight before I dive into anything else. And that was the place where I could do it because it was just me. My feet and nature Prayer is, is not a practice that comes really easy for me. So just opening that space and that time just to stop and pray for a minute. And those are to me, usually the best prayers that I have. It works to ground me and connect me spiritually in the morning. That personal discipline of intentionally leave things at the door, intentionally create just an open space where I can experience whatever God chooses to throw at me that morning.

#### 2 (29m 9s):

Now I ask that question a lot of times as I go out. It's like, what do you want me to see today? God? Like, what do you want me to notice? And I don't think I would do that if I were distracted in other ways.

### 3 (29m 20s):

Relatively recently, Denver kind of became this haven for a lot of migrants. So they started using the rec centers to house a lot of these individuals and a mile that way. There's a large rec center. So they closed it to allow that to have beds and places for people who were stepping off a bus with nothing but the clothes on their back. There was a group of individuals who were walking outta the rec center. They were refugees for Venezuela and just sort of look lost. They have no transportation either than their own two feet. So as a

runner to be able to stop and say in their language, welcome, do you need anything? I'm Molly, how can I help you? Here's where on your own two feet that you might find a place to plug into this neighborhood, a grocery store, a park, a playground. And that in and of itself is a pretty special thing.

Isn't that pretty cool? They're inviting God into their everyday with running. Some of you're like, I'm not a runner, Matt, that's okay. But how could you invite God at the beginning of your day, throughout your day? Paul teaches us to pray without ceasing it. It doesn't mean we have to be on our knees all the time. We can't. You gotta live your life. But you can talk with him all the time. Just invite him into those little things, those insignificant things. Because nothing is too small for God. Nothing is too insignificant. All the small things God sees, God cares. So it's my challenge to you and and just like there's this miracle here in the Old Testament one that maybe you've never heard before about Elisha and, and the bad acts. Jesus had some pretty small miracles too.

Have you ever thought about this? His first miracle when he turns water into wine, it, it's crazy 'cause it's mind blowing. But really it was to make the party last a little longer. Okay? Right? It's like, we wanna have fun longer. Jesus help us. And he does. There's another time where his disciples are frustrated and angry. They didn't even ask him for anything. They had finished fishing and he's like, let's go back out. And they caught the biggest catch they'd ever had. He came into their workplace to help them catch more fish. There's another time where Peter didn't want to pay his taxes. You ever been there? And Jesus says, Hey, don't worry about it. Coke, catch a fish. Look in its mouth and boom, there are two coins. Pay your taxes and mine.

And that's what happened. These little miracles, right? Why are those in there? Because God cares. He sees what we're going through in our life and he loves us and wants to answer those prayers. So, we can bring 'em to him. And, and even more than those small, small miracles, there's the huge miracle at the end where Jesus died on the cross, right, for our sins. And then three days later he rose from the dead. The greatest miracle of all time. Well, why does that matter? Because if God can do that, he can do the little things. And seriously, that's what Paul teaches us in Romans 8 32. It says, God did not keep his own son, but he gave him up for us. If God did this, won't he freely give us everything else?

He wants every little thing because he loves you and cares about you and wants to come through in some big ways, even in the small things. So all the small things, God cares, God sees. Let's pray. That there's nothing too small for you, nothing too insignificant. You care. Wow. Thank you for loving us that way.
